### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

**First aid measures****Skin Contact**

Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of water while removing all contaminated clothes and shoes. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse. If irritation persists or burns occur, get medical attention. For minor skin contact, avoid spreading material on unaffected skin. For severe burns, immediate medical attention is required.
